- ☐ The Mining Law nº14/2002, of June 26
- □ The Mining Regulation were approved through Decree no 28/2003, of June 17, 2003
- ☐ The Environmental Regulation for the Mining Activity was approved through Decree 26/2004, of June 30
- ☐ The Fiscal Regime was approved in 1994 and is now being review


Mineral Titles under the new Mining Law nº14/2002

Reconnaissance License valid for maximum of two years and non renewable (non exclusive)
 Exploration License, with a maximum duration of five years and renewable for a maximum of 10 years (with exclusivity)
 Mining Concession, with a maximum duration of twenty five (25) years, and renewable for a maximum of 25 years
 Mining certificate, with a duration of two years.
 A mining pass, granted for a term of twelve months and

renewable for the same period. (new permit)

ADVANTAGES FOR THE INVESTORS

- To increase security of tenure and transparency in the process of awarding the mineral titles and permits.
- To Incorporate the principle of "first come, first served" in the awarding of the mineral titles.
- To allow issuance of Mineral titles for longer periods of time.
- To reduce discretionary powers in the issuing and revocation of the mineral titles
- To give guarantees to the investors and stability to the fiscal regime.





THE NEW MINING REGULATION

- Spells out the terms and conditions for application and granting of the mineral titles and permits
- Define Licensing procedures, taxes and general procedures

Free and Public consultation of the maps and Cadastral Registration consultation (one public consultation computer, registrations and maps)


NO DISCRIMINATION

Application of the equal rules and criteria's for all people


OBJECTIVITY

Without subjective criteria's of evaluation


Time for License Obtention (Days)
