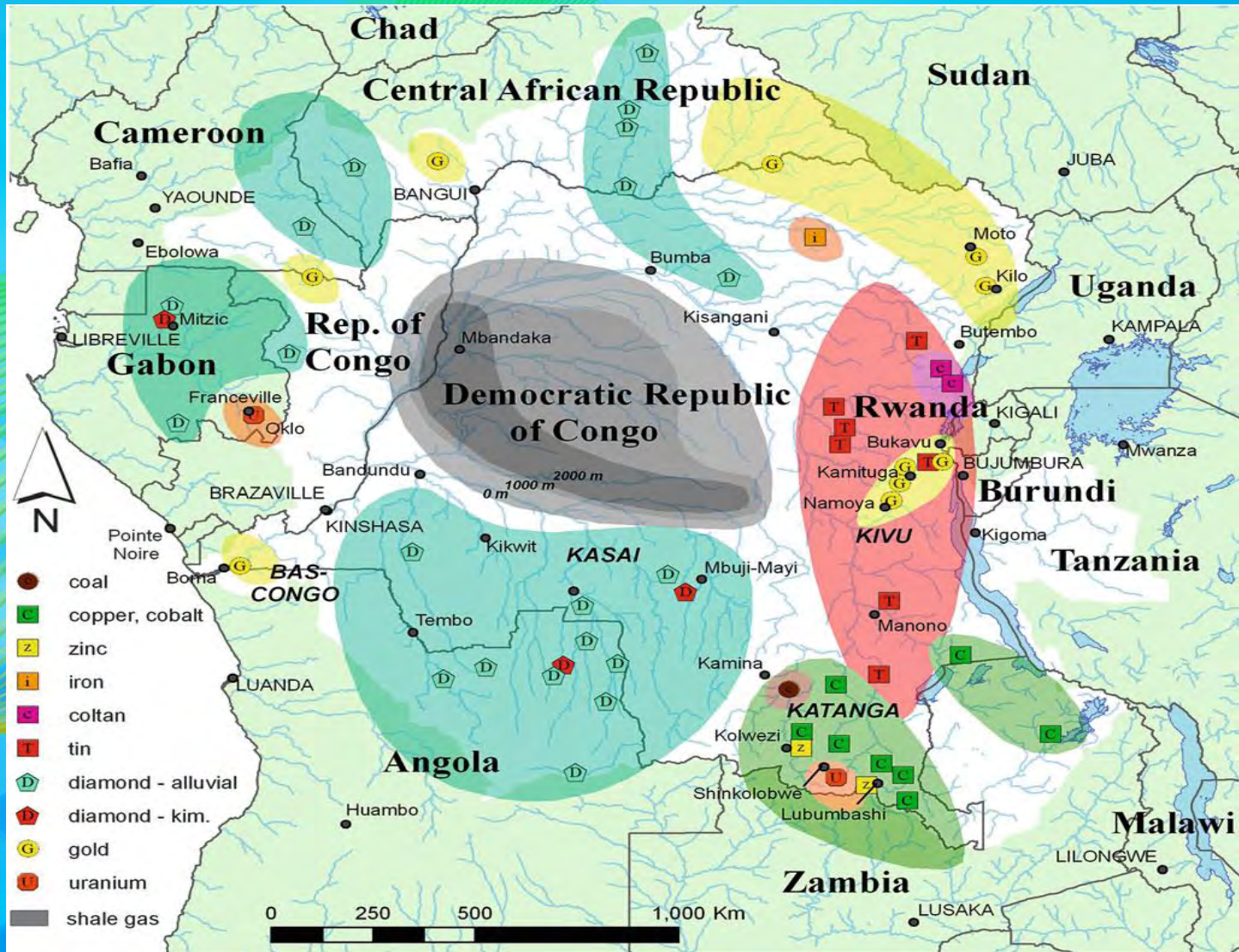

DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO

- Large country at the heart of Africa;
- Area: 2 345 000 km²;
- Populated with 70 million d'habitants
- Subdivide in 11 provinces;
- Main Town: Kinshasa, la capitale, Lubumbashi, Kisangani, Goma, Matadi, Kindu, Maniema, Mbandaka, Kananga, Mbuji-mayi, ...
- Endowed with rich and various mineral resources
- Issued in 2002 the current mining law to frame mineral sector



DRC MINERAL POTENTIAL



LE CADASTRE MINIER (CAMI)



- ◆ **Technical and Administrative Public establishment created under the 2002 law as one of regulatory bodies of the mining sector,**
- ◆ **CAMI is endowed with legal personality , financial and administrative autonomy**
- ◆ **CAMI is overseen by the Ministers of Mines et Finances**
- ◆ **CAMI is entitled to:**
 - Receive, register and process applications for granting, renewing, conversion and transferring mineral right,
 - Register and report on licences map all granted mineral rights and deliver related titles
 - Coordinate technical and environmental revues of mineral right applications ;
 - Oversee and validate the staking process for mining concessions
 - Initiate the cancelation of mineral rights
 - Acte as attorney in any transfert, lease and agreement option of mineral rights
 - Levy tax on concessions

COMPUTERIZED MINING SYSTEM

- 1. Set up in 2003, CAMI received financial support from World Bank to implement a modern and computerized mining cadastre;**
- 2. In the same year the World Bank signed an agreement with a consultant for the designing and implementation of the software for licences management;**
- 3. The use of the software proved to be more ineffective because several gaps related to it bad design and less convivial handling;**
- 4. Expressed the need to design correctly a good system supporting a Geographics Information System with and an efficient Data Base Management System**

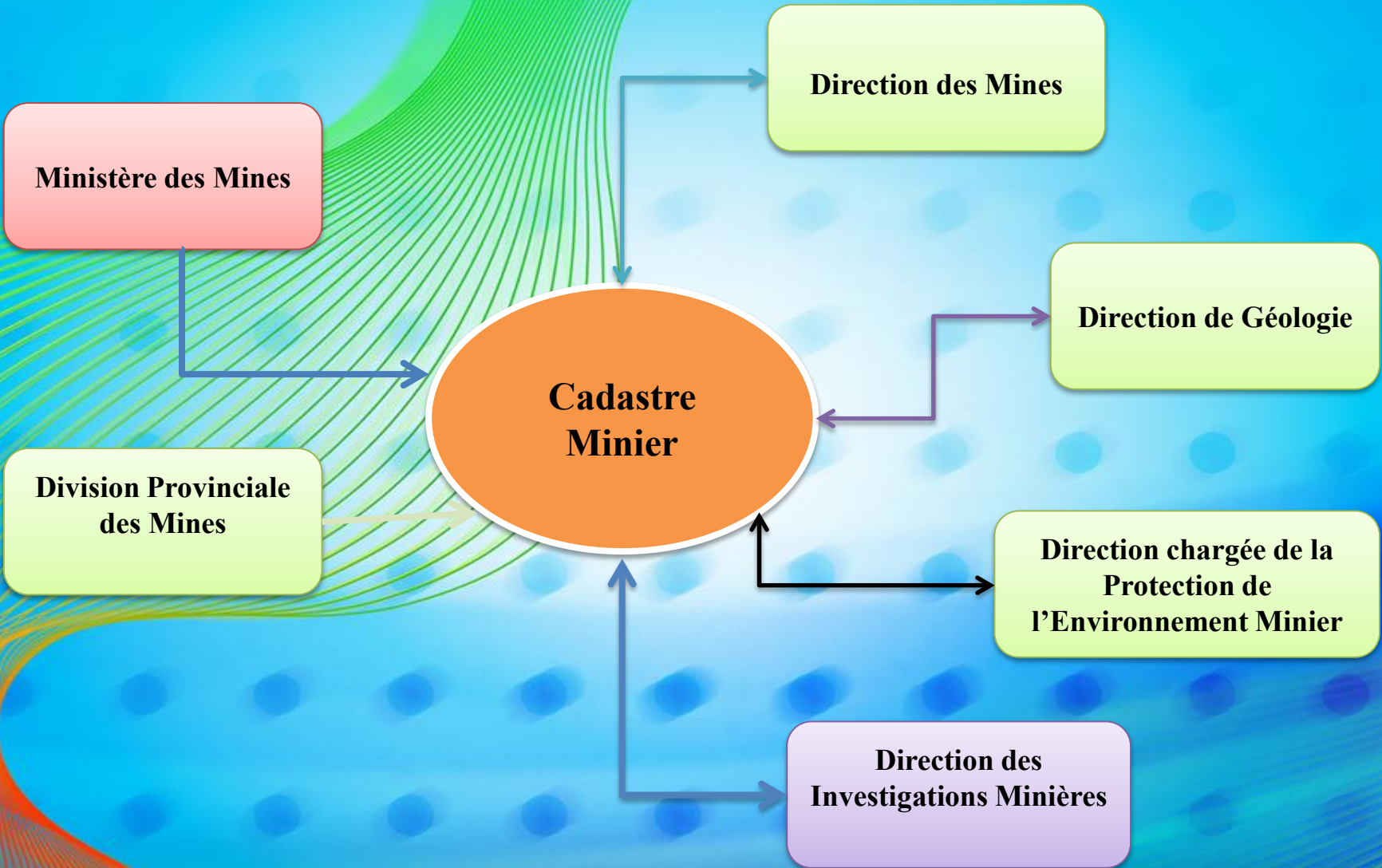

DECENTRALISATION



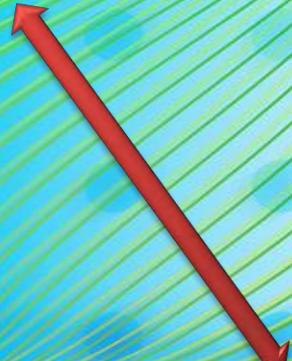
- **10 regional offices to be set up**

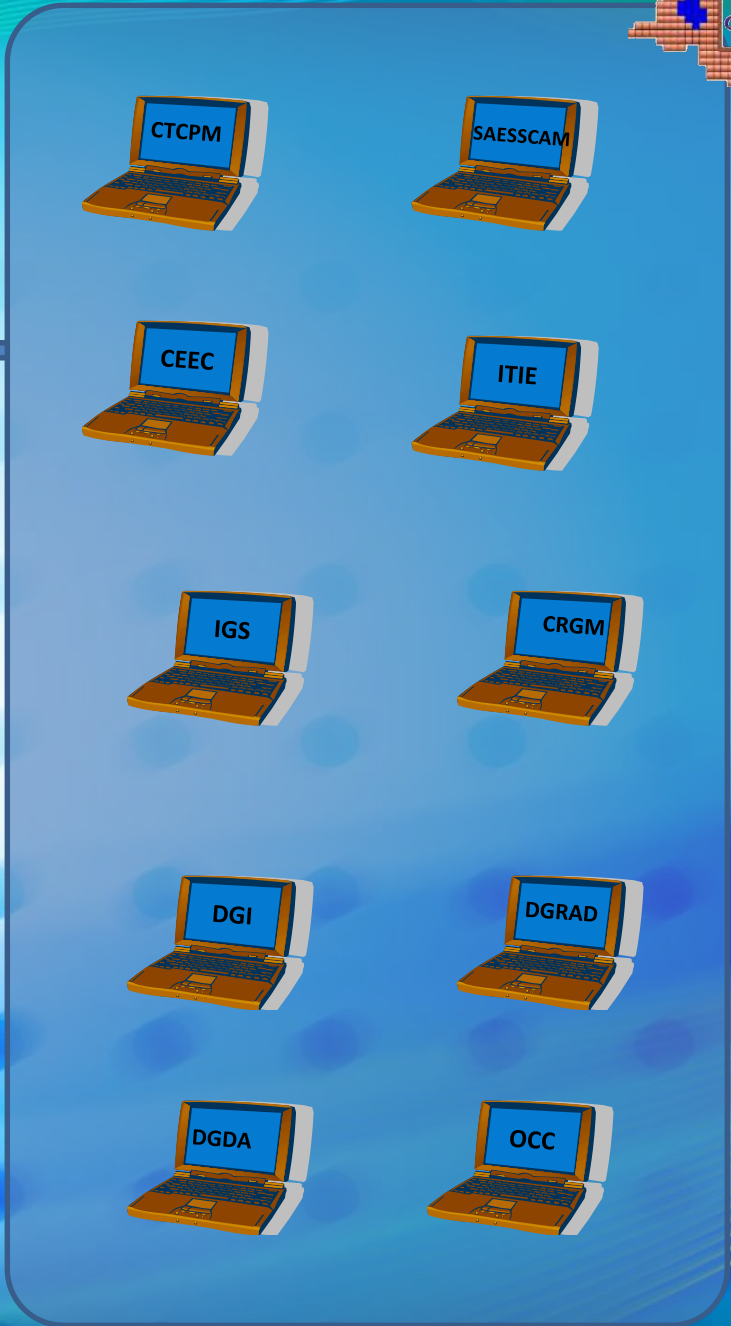

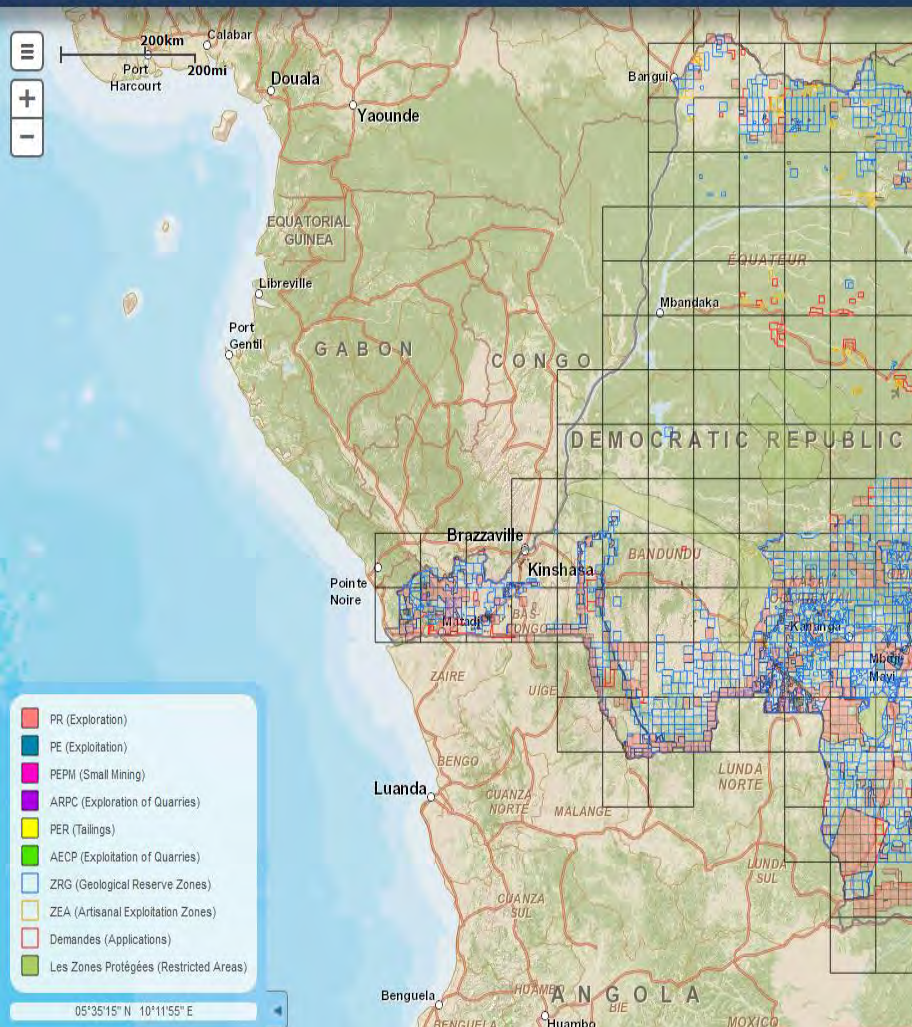
