


Who, What, Where...

- Worlds largest Platinum Group Metals mining company

The Problem

- Legacy System
- In-house
- Still required development to accommodated new legislation
- Inefficient required significant development costs
- Inflexible not user friendly
- Governance -not workflow driven



Objectives

- Determine Best Practice
 - Identify suitable system
 - Implement
 - Design Data Model
 - Attempt to determine cost effectiveness

- Implement Best Practice
 - incorporate into Group Procedures



Identified Solution Requirements

- Needs to address internal & external governance
- Needs to become a Group Standard
- Needs to be efficient and flexible
- Needs to be scalable
- Needs to address DMR requirements within the SA jurisdiction
- Needs to be cost effective

Data model generation

- Due to time & budget constraints it was decided to model a single right/asset/licence group
- Focused on most important group of rights to manage
 - Prospecting rights
- In depth work- flow modelling produced the required data model
- Combined effort between client & vendor


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


Aris Work Flow Model 1





Aris Work Flow Model 2






The Data Model

Key concepts were:

- Majority of rights/assets/licence shapes based on surface freehold shape (>90%)
- Flexicadastre designed to work efficiently with coordinate entry licence shape
- Needed to create alternative licence shape generation concept
- Loaded generic group of licences (property) from which other rights/asset/licences could be built
- The property licences were derived from the same source the DMR used for their management system





Map Screen Shot






Data Model

- Management of Mineral Rights linked spatially to Surface Rights
- Workflows had to strictly adhere to:
 - internal requirements (governance and audit)
 - external requirements (DMR legislation)
- Resultant model combined both surface and mineral right management by referencing them to third group of licences referred to as generic properties...through the related licence tab





AngloAmerican Prospecting Right **High Level Work flow**






Prospecting Right Detailed Work flow







Pitfalls

- Trust the vendor !!
 - They know what they are talking about
- Internal workflows not detailed enough
- Internal work flows had to be remodelled to accommodated Flexicadastre
- Spatial data from external agency (government) assumed to be clean...it wasn't
- Report requirements need to be an integral part of implementation (see first point)



Conclusions

- Producing the right data model is the key to success in managing surface and mineral rights using Flexicadastre
- We have chosen the right tool for the job
- It needs to be a dynamic process
- We feel we have produced a data model that can be applied to any prospecting / mining management requirement...independent of commodity and company
